1	MR. OWENS: Good afternoon, everyone.
2	We are going to open up the following hearing
3	for we are going to open up the public hearing
4	for the following projects. Anyone wishing to
5	speak, please come to this end, state your name
6	and I would like you to speak no more than five
7	minutes. So we are going to open up the hearing
8	for 488 Broadway for individual comments, or 488
9	Broadway Arcade, LLC.
10	MR. SCOTT: Vice Chair, before I go
11	or Chair of the Hearing, before we have them
12	talk, I will confirm that we've sent out the
13	public hearing notice, we've published the public
14	hearing notice, so the hearing has been published
15	in accordance with the IDA statute.
16	MR. OWENS: Thank you.
17	MR. SARRAF: Hello, everybody. My name
18	is David Sarraf. I am here representing 488
19	Broadway Arcade, LLC, and I just wanted to take a
20	quick moment to go over some of our proposed
21	plans for the project.
22	As many of you know, 488 Broadway is a
23	building right down the street, Downtown Albany.

1	It is a five-story, mixed-use building. It was
2	formerly a mixture of commercial space, as well
3	as retail space. Floors two through five were
4	used as offices and have been vacant for some
5	time.
6	The first floor is retail, which
7	actually the final retail tenant recently moved
8	out, so now the entire building is completely
9	vacant. Our plans for the building are to
10	maintain the first floor as retail and try to
11	lease it up and create market-rate residential
12	apartments on floors two through five.
13	Each floor is going to be made up of a
14	combination of studio apartments and one bedroom
15	apartments. There are 17 apartments on each of
16	the floors two through five and they will
17	include, you know, high-end finishes, hardwood
18	flooring, granite or quartz countertops, high-end
19	cabinets, quality fixtures, tiled floor
20	bathrooms, a lot of which you see in the new
21	residential housing in Downtown Albany.
22	I'm trying to think if there's anything
23	else. Studio apartments will be between six and

1	700 square feet. One-bedrooms will be between
2	eight and 900 square feet, and that's pretty much
3	it.
4	If anybody has any questions, I'm happy
5	to answer.
6	MR. OWENS: Are there any individual
7	comments?
8	(No comments heard.)
9	MR. OWENS: I guess there being none,
10	the public hearing for 488 Broadway Arcade is
11	closed. Thank you.
12	(Whereupon the above-entitled matter was
13	concluded at 11:37 a.m.)
